

Dear Friends,

Holy Week begins on Palm Sunday, April 13. The word "holy" in the scriptures means something set apart for a special purpose. We worship a "Holy" God who is like no other. We read the "Holy" Bible as a book like no other which gives us insights into our God, as well as the living of our lives. We gather at Christ's table for "Holy" Communion, a meal like no other, which gifts us with the presence of the *Living Bread of Life*, Jesus Christ.

Similarly, "Holy Week" is a special week set apart for Christians to commemorate and celebrate a week like no other. On Palm Sunday we remember Jesus riding triumphantly into Jerusalem as Israel's once and future king, calling us to embrace the way of peace. As Jesus chases the money changers from the Jerusalem temple, we do well to remember that worship is only true worship when we love God and do justice. Thursday, we remember the upper room where Jesus speaks to his disciples of his life-redeeming death as he offers us his body and blood in the symbolic form of bread and wine. Jesus is betrayed, arrested, abandoned, tried, abused, and finally executed on a cross. It is always a mystery why we call this Friday "Good", but Jesus teaches us that "only if a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, will it bear fruit." (John 12:24 adapted). That is the mystery of Easter morning!

So, beginning April 13, we enter Holy Week. These are eight days set apart for walking with Jesus from Palm Sunday's parade to Good Friday's cross to Easter's empty tomb and the good news that Christ is risen! These are holy days. But as we make this journey, we are reminded of one more thing which we dare to call "holy". And that is us ... Christ's people. For what special purposes has God set us apart? And how do the events of Holy Week help us to understand what that means? As we follow Jesus, we too are called to walk his path which may very well bring us suffering and sacrifice, but it is also the way that seeks to share God's gift of love and life with all people and all creation.

The Cemetery Board is seeking volunteers to assist with mowing and trimming at the cemetery for the 2025 mowing season. We typically mow weekly using zero turn mowers. The time required for mowing is typically 2.5 to 3 hours per cutting. We trim every other week with gas powered string trimmers which are provided. The time for trimming is approximately three hours. The more people the less time it will take. Even if

Treasurer's Report:

February ended in the red, by \$4,699.77

Finance Board: (Diane)

- Mardi Gras profit was \$1,691. This money will go into the general fund and will be recorded in the March report.

Pastor's Report:

- An Ash Wednesday Service was held at Homestead.
- The church received thank-you notes from the Girl Scouts troop, expressing gratitude for using the building for their meetings.
- Grape Cluster Trivia thanked the church for all their assistance.
- The yearly membership booklet is looking for sponsorships from area businesses. Cost is \$300.
- Six new members will join our church on April 5-6.

Old Business

Constitution—Article VII, Section 9—revise wording for perpetual care funding for the cemetery.

- A meeting was held with Bob Zick, Jon Bauer, Jack Harty, Jim Gephardt, Ben Alspach, and Pastor Kurt. Bob reviewed the steps for the cemetery board to become a legal entity.
- Rhonda proposed holding a joint meeting between the Council and Cemetery Board to discuss the incorporation of the Cemetery Board. The motion was seconded by Diane and subsequently approved.

Website Update:

- Updated the Holy Week calendar.
- We aim to find an individual from the church to serve as our social media contact.
 Dottie will create a short job description for publication in the newsletter and bulletins.

Congregational Meeting:

- The Annual Report will be presented.
- Internal Review report
- Delegates to the Eastern Association Spring meeting will be approved.
- The proposed amendments to the Constitution will be decided through a paper ballot vote.
- Rhonda noted that proposed Constitutional changes were shared with the
 congregation 10 days before the March meeting, not two weeks as required. She
 supported voting on resizing the church's boards and committees at the March
 meeting and recommended a motion to waive the two-week notice requirement
 be made at the Congregational meeting.
- The Constitutional changes were approved unanimously by the council through an email vote.

New Business

Easter Breakfast will be held 8:30-9:30, between services. Ben will order sausage from Williams Brothers. He will talk to Carol about including details in the bulletins to inform the congregation about what to bring for breakfast. There was a discussion on appointing someone as the point person for breakfast, but no one volunteered.

Supply Pastor for May 3-4 has been secured.

Susan discussed the School District of Washington's Back to School fair held on July 30 and how St. Peter's can help.

A Christmas Rummage Sale will be held the last weekend in September.
