**St. Peter's UCC Cemetery** is celebrating 150 years this year--A Bit of History--June 27, 1886 The secretary was instructed to inform Mr. Glosemeyer and Mr. Hausmann that the congregation would not build a line fence and would not assume any blame for damages. March 31, 1889 It was moved and carried that a new fence be made on the front of the cemetery of sawed oak pickets. The council should see to it that same be made properly. It was moved and carried that only the pastor of the St. Peter's Church be permitted to officiate at burials on the St. Peter's Cemetery. Other ministers must have the consent of the resident pastor, and in his absence must get a permit from the church council.
