Another highlight marking **St. Peter's UCC Cemetery** celebrating 150 years in 2025. A Bit of History- October 5, 1913 August Brinkmeyer reported that Geo. Hausmann's mules jumped the fences and were trespassing on the cemetery. The secretary was instructed to send Geo. Hausmann written notice to keep his mules off the cemetery. May 28, 1916 Resolved that by the burial of non-members the church bells should only ring during the burial service and that non-members should pay \$13 for use of the church. Divided as follows: \$10 to church fund, \$2 to janitor and \$1 for organist.
