COME ONE, COME ALL to the Cemetery Anniversary Picnic on May 18 from 11 a.m.-2 p.m. Barbeque and sides provided by the American Legion. Fun games and activities for all ages. Bounce House. Learn how to use Dowsing Rods--magic, myth, or the mind???? Katie Dieckhaus (Washington Historical Society) will entertain us with stories and history of some of our "occupants" who helped shape St. Peter's and Washington. One of our "occupants"- Friedrich Wilhelm Stumpe was born May 5, 1831 in Hanover, Germany. He emigrated to America in 1857 and settled in the Washington, MO "suburbs". In 1860 he established a brickyard near Washington, making 500,000 bricks/year- perhaps the bricks that were used to build St. Peter's. He served in the Civil War with the Franklin County Homeguards. By 1874 he was a farmer with 24 acres. Friedrich was a school board member for 16 years, a city councilman, and a president of St. Peter's Council.
