

St. Peter's UCC Church Council Meeting Minutes

September 23, 2025

Treasurer's Report:

August concluded with a balance in the general fund of \$23,125

Chuck moved to approve the treasurer's report, and Dottie seconded. Motion passed.

Pastor's Report:

- A written report of activities for the month was presented by Pastor Kurt.
- The Eastern Association of the Missouri Mid-South will hold its fall meeting at our church on Sun., Oct. 5, 2025, 3:00-5:00
- Confirmation began on Sept. 21 with a parent meeting. The five confirmands will be blessed on Sept. 28.
- Pastor Kurt will be on vacation Nov. 15-16.
- Pastor Kurt requested time for continuing education from Oct. 27-30.
- Vacation request for Dec. 27-28.

Jon moved to approve Pastor Kurt's vacation requests. Rhonda seconded the motion. The motion was passed.

Board and Committee Reports

Building & Grounds: (Chuck)

- Alley signs are being mounted.
- B & G received two quotes for the dining room bathroom updates totaling, combined, below \$50,000. The board is in the process of finalizing some decisions before presenting the information to Council.
- B & G got quotes for the remote door opener; final details will be settled before presenting to Council.

Cemetery Board: (Dottie)

• Helpers' cleanup is scheduled for Sat., Oct. 4 at the cemetery.

Board of Christian Education: (Jennifer)

- Confirmation classes commenced on Sept. 21.
- Bibles will be presented to the five confirmands on Sept. 28, accompanied by a Blessing.

Finance Board: (Diane)

• Trivia Night is scheduled for Oct. 18.

Worship Committee: (Susan)

 Molly Derner conducted usher training on Sun., Aug. 24. She provided information about procedures, drills, AED usage, and reviewed first aid kits.

Evangelism Committee: (Mary Jo)

 Game day is scheduled for Oct. 2 at 12:00. Participants may bring a sack lunch, which will be followed by game activities.

Mission Group: (Rhonda)

 Rhonda presented the receipts from the Back Bay Mission Trip. A total of \$2,700 was donated for the trip. Gas expenses amounted to \$292.04, food expenses were \$522.16, motel expenses totaled \$925.93, and Kurt's airline expenses were \$510.37. The total

- expenses came to \$2,250.50. Of this amount, a \$200 deposit will be allocated for next year's reservation, resulting in a final total of \$2,450.50.
- Jennifer moved, and Mary Jo seconded, that the remaining balance of \$249 be sent to Back Bay Mission. The motion was approved.

Old Business

Constitution-Article VII, section 9-Revise wording for perpetual care funding:

- Listening sessions are being held regarding the transition of the Cemetery to a Not-for-Profit (NFP) corporation for St. Peter's United Church of Christ. The sessions occur each weekend, with the final session scheduled for Oct. 4 & 5. A fact sheet is provided at these meetings.
- The final resolution will be presented at a meeting on Oct. 11 & 12.
- There was a discussion regarding the distribution percentages should the church close. The
 proposal specified that 50% of remaining assets would be allocated to the Cemetery and
 50% to a mission of the church's choosing. Jon Bauer moved to retain the proposed 50%
 split for the distribution of assets; Jennifer seconded the motion. The motion passed with
 nine votes in favor and one opposed.

Website Update:

Donna Houchins' is working on moving music from the services to the website.

Internal Review:

- A positive 2024 Internal Review report was presented to the Council by the chairman, Patty Wood.
- Jon moved to accept the 2024 internal review report, and Cindy seconded the motion.
- The report is scheduled to be presented at the October congregational meeting.

Pictorial Church Directory:

- Photography sessions are scheduled for Nov. 6 & 7, 2-8:30 p.m. and Sat., Nov. 8, 10 a.m.-4 p.m. Each session takes about 45-60 minutes.
- Sign up online or before/after services; details for online registration will be provided.

Nomination Committee for 2026:

 All Board and Committee positions are currently filled, with the exception of Building & Grounds, which has one vacancy remaining.

Contents & Assembly of Congregational meeting packets:

- Packets need to be in the mail the week of Sept. 29
- Packet includes: Agenda, Spring meeting minutes and treasurer's report, budget proposal, audit initiative, internal review report, cemetery initiative, and board nominations. We will also provide the redline version of the constitution pertaining to cemetery, as well as a copy of the PowerPoint presentation and all resolutions.

Sanctuary Temperature for organ and piano:

 A dehumidifier has been placed in the sanctuary behind the organ to help keep the instruments in tune.

Constitutional Amendment Regarding Regular External Audit — Article IX, Section 12:

- **Currently it reads,** At a minimum of every 5 years, the council appoints an independent certified public accountant to conduct a review of the financial books of the church and all its organizations and accounts that operate under the church's federal tax identification number.
- The change would read: At the council's discretion, an independent certified public accountant can be appointed to conduct a review of the financial books for the church and all its organizations and accounts that operate under the church's federal tax identification number.

Jon moved to approve and present the revised audit wording to the congregation, seconded by Chuck. The motion carried.

New Business

Christmas Service Schedule:

- Pastor Kurt shared there will be 3 services on Christmas Eve.
- The Children's Christmas program will be held in the auditorium. The date has not been decided.

2026 Budget Approval:

• Diane presented the 2026 budget proposal. After review, Chuck moved to approve it with a 1% employee raise and adjusted revenue to balance the budget.

Additional:

• Pastor Kurt noted that Rev. Schwab presented information about the sanctuary's history, stained glass windows, bells, and architecture. The presentation was recorded for sharing on the website and with children.

The next meeting will be held on Tues., Oct. 21.

THE HEISEL FAMILY LEGACY: A Tradition of Love and Service

The Heisel family's connection to Emmaus is a story rooted in love, faith, and generations of quiet generosity. It began with Esther Roedder, who lived and worked on the Marthasville campus in the 1960's and 1970's. Her sister, Alice. supported both her and Emmaus by creating Ivory soap dolls for the Bazaar and handcrafting a quilt each year for the quilt auction. These small acts of care helped raise funds and planted the first seeds of a family legacy. Alice's daughter, Joan Heisel, carried that tradition forward. A nurse by profession and a caregiver by nature, Joan served on the Emmaus Board of Directors and volunteered her time and skills to support the mission. She and her husband, Jim, were faithful members of Pilgrim UCC in Labadie, MO for many years before moving to St. Peter's United Church of Christ in Washington, MO, where they lived out their values through a lifelong commitment to Emmaus. Their daughters, Amy, Nancy, and Peggy, grew up visiting their great-aunt Esther on campus, building relationships with the people we serve and becoming part of the Emmaus

family. Joan was known for her gentle spirit; Jim, for his warmth and easy smile. Together, they lived a life of kindness and faith. When Joan passed in 2010 and Jim in 2024, they left behind a generous estate gift to Emmaus. In their honor,



we have named a training room in our Learning Lab after them, a space where our nurse trainer equips staff with the skills needed to provide exceptional support. It is a fitting tribute to a nurse, a family, and a legacy built on compassion. The Heisel family reminds us that when you share Emmaus with your loved ones, the impact grows—across generations.
