In 2025 **St. Peter's UCC Cemetery** is celebrating 150 years--A Bit of History-Dec. 27, 1891 It was moved and carried that if a regular member of the congregation, or a confirmed child of such, dies, the janitor shall ring the large bell when his or her death has been announced, provided, however, that the deceased attended church regularly and participated in the Holy Communion. If an unconfirmed child died, the small bell should be tolled.

Walter Johan Oberhaus 2/26/1894-9/29/1918 Walter was employed by the Washington Painting and Decorating Co. before being drafted into the army in WWI. He received his training at Camp Funston, KS and was sent overseas in April 1918 as a member of Company C 140th Infantry. He was killed in action in France. Walter was a Purple Heart (awarded to those who have been wounded or killed by enemy action) and a Gold Star recipient. The concept of a Gold Star emerged during WWI when families displayed service flags with blue stars for each family member serving. If a service member died, the blue star was replaced with a gold star, symbolizing their sacrifice. Walter's obituary states that his funeral service will be held as soon as the "closing ban" for Influenza is lifted.
