Another highlight marking **St. Peter's UCC Cemetery** celebrating 150 years in 2025. A Bit of History-January 6, 1918 Rev. Schuch, Oscar Foerster, Gus Egbert, and Albert Mische were appointed to collect donations for War Relief. It was also decided that all young male members called to the Armed Service should be excused of paying their dues. July 14, 1918 The committee on War Relief reported collecting \$224.60. Of this, \$100 was at once sent off and the rest held in abeyance till some future time. January 5, 1919 It was resolved that of the \$132.35 representing the War Relief fund, \$35 be sent off for War Relief and the rest deposited to the funds of the congregation.
