St. Peter's UCC Missions in September 2023

- WERF:** Washington Emergency Relief received 252 calls in September. By giving out 25 grants totaling up to \$5,256.27, we were able to assist 60 people in the Franklin County area. Ten of those grants went toward electric bills, twelve towards rent, two towards water and one went to pay for fuel.
- The Harvest Table:** The Harvest Table served 614 meals in September. In addition to providing food and fellowship for all, Blessing Bags, blankets, tents, sleeping bags, and raffles for gift cards were given.
- Salam Free Clinic:** The Free Clinic had two patients in September. We are busy getting the word out by handing out flyers, using social media, and sharing information with the Hunger and Homelessness Task Force.
- Food Pantry News:** Thank you to ALL the volunteers who help the food pantry continue its vital ministry in our community. In September, 118 individuals representing 45 families were served. We also thank the following for their generous donations —September Food Pantry donors: Joline Logan, Brenda Bruns, Betty Peffermann, Downtown Washington-Foodstock, Dan Buschmeyer, United Way.
- Festival of Sharing Kits:** Thanks to your generosity, we donated 20 hygiene kits to the Festival of Sharing! Those will be used by people around the world who may suddenly be without homes and basic necessities, such as refugees and victims of natural disasters.

Looking Forward to Mission Moments in November

Nov. 12: We look forward to learning about the Back Bay Mission, a ministry of the United Church of Christ located in Mississippi. The mission of Back Bay is, "Strengthening Neighborhoods, Seeking Justice, Transforming Lives." Back Bay Mission meets emergency needs and helps people begin their journeys out of poverty. **There will be an informal gathering after worship to learn more about this important mission, and an opportunity to take a mission trip together to Back Bay in the Spring of '24.**

Nov. 19: During our worship service on the 19th, we will be joined by Darlene Sowell, the Executive Director for Unleashing Potential (formerly known as Neighborhood Houses). The Mission of UP, which is located in St. Louis, is "to close the opportunity gap for children and youth by building on their strengths. We create educational and empowering experiences through early childhood education, after school programs, youth development and enrichment camps." Just like Emmaus Homes and Every Child's Hope, UP is another historic ministry of the UCC in the region. We look forward to hearing more about the transformative work our covenant partner is doing in STL.

As Pastor Eric says: "We are all in ministry together – We are part of something bigger."

Treasurer's Report:

The General Fund is still negative.

The Finance Board is trying to decrease insurance cost. This is the biggest expense we have. A motion was made and seconded to approve the Treasurer's Report. The motion passed.

Senior Pastor's Report:

- Pastor Kurt attended the 175th anniversary services at Casco.
- He also attended MO Mid-South
- The Grape Cluster will meet here Oct. 23.
- Work has been done to update the wording in the wedding policy. It now lists a flat fee for non-members and has updated alcohol wording, per the new church alcohol policy.
- A motion was made and seconded to approve the new wording in the wedding policy. The motion passed.
- Nominating was discussed. We need one more nominee for Council and several for various boards and committees.

Associate Pastor's Report:

Children's bulletins have been well received.

Messy Church is going well.

Boards and Committees:

Building and Grounds:

- Elevator phone cost will be \$61 per month.
- The elevator had a noise & needed new rollers.
- The boiler is ready to go for winter.
- The leak in the balcony has been fixed.
- Tuckpointing will be done soon.

Cemetery Board:

- New section layout is completed.
- Cornerstones have been removed.
- Fall cleanup of cemetery was done.
- There is a proposal to limit the first row on the east street to flat stones only.
- The new green section will be laid out.
- There is a proposal to charge more for weekend/holiday burials.
- There is a proposal to allow purchase of memorial trees with memorial plaques.

Worship Committee:

- The upcoming worship schedule was presented.

Christian Education:

- The children's Christmas program was discussed and a program was chosen.

Mission:

- Nov. 19 - Mission Moment.
- There will be a Giving Tree for One Child's Hope.
- About 20 Festival of Sharing kits were collected.

Old Business:

Website Update:

- The group had its first meeting with Pastor Eric; The next meeting will be on Oct. 24.

Printing of Hymns:

- An image of the hymnal page can be shown to the online viewers. This can be tried to see how it works for these viewers.
- There were additional comments that the hymn lyrics in the bulletin are more accessible for a wider group of members than is reading the hymnals.

New Business:

Life Vac Choking Rescue Device:

- A Live Vac was shown. It is a suction device that can be used on a choking victim if the Heimlich is not working in a choking incident.
- We have one unit available for the church and may want to get more, to be able to keep them in areas where food is consumed.
- They have both child and adult masks in the kits.
- A motion was made and seconded to purchase 3 more Life Vacs. The motion passed.

AED Notice:

- We need to put a notice out to members that we have the AED so that everyone knows we have it and where it is.

5th Sunday:

- The 5th Sunday is coming up and it is the day of the Congregational Meeting. Therefore, there will not be a meal that day.
