WERF: July was a busy-as-usual month for Washington Emergency Relief Fund. Out of the 130 calls received, WERF was able to assist 54 individuals. The grants given consisted of four for electricity, two for water bills, and 13 for rent consisting of \$4,424.23

The Harvest Table: "July's numbers were down a bit." We made and fed 565 meals, gave away one tent 🏕️, two sleeping bags, two sleeping bag mats, five Blessing Bags, and lots and lots of socks and underwear.

*One sturdy, wide tooth comb removed from the package. Must be sturdy with at least 6" of teeth.

No pocket combs or pics.

*One fingernail or toenail clipper removed from package.

*One bath size bar of soap in the original package

*One toothbrush in the original package.

*Ten standard size band-aids

*For each kite we need a \$2 donation for the processing fee.

Justice Witness

Come Discuss the Book: **The Children are Free**

Back in June the Justice & Witness Mission Team invited members to read a book, The Children are Free, during the summer with the promise that there would be an opportunity for conversation. The time has come! Please join us on **September 24** following worship for a discussion about this book as part of our Open & Affirming discernment process. Please contact Pastor Eric if you'd like assistance obtaining the book. A review of the book is below. Thank you!

In The Children Are Free, Rev. Jeff Miner and John Tyler Connoley offer a comprehensive yet easy-to-read examination of the biblical evidence regarding loving same-sex relationships and God's attitude toward them.

In Chapter One, the authors lead the reader through a discussion of each of the six passages traditionally used against gay, lesbian, and bisexual people. They demonstrate how an anti-gay interpretation is a misapplication of these scriptures.

In Chapter Two, Miner and Connoley turn our attention to the biblical stories and passages that affirm loving same-sex relationships. Did you know Jesus once met a gay person? Jesus' loving response is just one of the well-researched stories presented in this chapter.

Chapters Three and Four ask readers to take seriously the call of Jesus to think more deeply about biblical rules and act to make a connection between early Church conflicts and today.

St. Peter's United Church of Christ Church Council Meeting Highlights 21 August 2023

Guest Presentation about Meals on Wheels:

Meals on Wheels has been under the Presbyterian Church "umbrella" since its beginning (50+ years). However, as the Presbyterian Church has their own program at this time, the Meals on Wheels program needs a different organization whose umbrella they can be under. They are requesting to be under St. Peter's umbrella and use our EIN number. (They are only asking to use our EIN number; no funding would need to come from St. Peter's.)

- Over 100 volunteers share the duties of a delivery schedule that runs three routes daily and serves 14-15 people per route.
- Some clients are served every day and some only certain days of the week.
- The hospital prepares the food, and many members from this church volunteer.
- United Way funds this.

They checked into whether there could be liability issues if Meals on Wheels is under our EIN and there are not. The hospital makes the food and the drivers are volunteer. Meals on Wheels can supply us with accounting info.

Before we commit to assuming this role, we want to see past annual accounting information. We also need to check with our insurance to make sure there are no issues with it. We need to answer these questions before we can make a decision. This item will be tabled until next month, pending answers to our questions.

Treasurer's Report:

The Building Fund doesn't have enough in it to cover all current projects/responsibilities. Funds will need to be moved to cover these projects This was noted on the Congregational Meeting Minutes from Aug. 19-20. We would like to put an appeal in the newsletter that we need to replenish the Building Fund for these projects. As they are capital improvements, we can use funds from the Memorial Fund. A motion was made and seconded to pay for the tuckpointing project from the Memorial Fund. The motion passed.

July was a higher income month.

We would like to consider treasurer training or a shadow person to train new treasurers for succession, since currently treasurers change every 1-2 years.

A motion was made and seconded to approve the Treasurer's Report. The motion passed.

Senior Pastor's Report:

- There was a gathering on **General Synod** on Wednesday, Aug. 23.
- **Foodstock** occurs August 26; donations support Washington food pantries.
- **Rally Day**, Sept. 9-10, promotes learning opportunities and ministries here.
- The **Missouri Mid-South Conference** meeting is Sept. 17. We will need delegates.
- **Pastor Kurt's Installation** is November 5.
- We received a thank-you note for the t-shirts display.

- Pastor Kurt has a Continuing Education request. Jan 6-13 there is seminar in El Salvador that he would like to attend. He will need \$800 from the Continuing Education budget. A motion to approve this was made and seconded. The motion passed.
- A Tuesday night group called “Manna and More” is offering food on Tuesday nights on our parking lot. They are not affiliated with any specific church.

Associate Pastor’s Report:

There is a lot going on with Christian Ed.

- VBS was successfully completed.
- The *Prayground* is being modified by a kid-friendly bulletin board, developed to help youth understand and become more involved in the worship service.

Sunday School starts Sept. 10 at 9:15 a.m.

- Bible Presentation to 3rd graders and Confirmands is also scheduled that day.
- Each group will receive age-appropriate versions.
- Pastor Eric is seeking better ways to let families know what is happening and promote these activities.
- Recruiting Sunday School teachers and nursery staff is also ongoing.
- A suggestion was received to purchase a large map of Palestine. Kids can put a star or other marker on where events referenced in the service happened and gain perspective on Bible events. A map has been found and BCE gave approval to order.

Conference Annual Gathering is coming up in October.

Boards and Committees:

Building and Grounds:

- They checked with the Event Committee about the idea to open the wall between the kitchen and auditorium and it was decided not to pursue this.
- Elevator phone – A bid was received for \$500 to install and then \$51 month service.
- Tuckpointing project was approved by the Congregation. There is a suggestion that photos are taken for future reference regarding where the work was done.
- Parking lot repair work is done; it has to settle before it can be sealed.
- AC unit for quilting room - would cost \$10,000 to replace. We have a window unit now that is working fine so it was decided to stay with this.
- Auditorium carpet needs cleaning. We do have replacement squares if they are needed.
- AC unit on the roof that services the auditorium was replaced.

Cemetery Board:

- This Saturday a group will meet to lay out new sections.
- Someone came to look at the trees. We will get an estimate and long-term action plan regarding maintenance and care.
- A new brochure for the cemetery is almost finished.

Worship Committee:

- Still waiting for additional info on new paraments.
- Choir resumes Sept. 6.

Christian Education:

- Blessing of backpacks occurred, and educators were recognized.

Old Business:

Constitution Article Review and Perpetual Care of Cemetery:

- We need more information regarding the policies of what other churches with cemeteries do to address this. State laws control what is allowed.

AED:

- AED training is Aug. 24 at 6 p.m. for Council, ushers, and staff. (This regards equipment training to use for emergency health events.)

New Business:

WERF:

- WERF asked permission to start a fundraising campaign and would reach out to other churches as well.

ECC Choral Concert:

- ECC Choral Dept would like to have a concert here on Fri., Dec. 1.

WINGS Event:

- WINGS organization may hold a fundraising event here on Sat., Nov 4.

Website:

There are concerns about the current website. Nothing there entices people to come here. There are few photos and mostly just descriptive text. We have paid a fee which allows re-design, so we can update the current content ourselves as part of our overall marketing. We would like to form a small group that will take this on.
