Harvest Table



Mary shared breakfast (provided by members of St. Peter's) with members and guests. Her "Strengthen the Conference" fundraising bike ride took her through the conference, beginning in St. Joseph Missouri and culminating at Eden Theological Seminary.

Mission Update:

Things were still busy at WERF. We received 187 calls in May. The 26 grants given helped a total of 72 of our Franklin County neighbors. Eight grants (totaling \$5,714.14) were for electric, 13 for rent, four for water, and one for propane,.

The Harvest Table served 672 meals. We had eager and very helpful volunteers. Besides providing meals, the Take Home Table gave out shorts, tee shirts, dog and cat food, chips, snacks, fruits and veggies, two Cardinal shirts and gift cards.

The Salam Free Clinic provided medical care for six patients in May. Four were return patients and two were new. Nurse Leesa was caring and attentive to all patients as the doctor was available via phone Facetime.

Throughout the month of May, members of St. Peter's contributed enough items to complete 20 bags that will be shared with children from the area in the event they are removed from their home.

St. Peter's United Church of Christ Church Council Meeting Highlights 19 June 2023

Guest Presentation on Gun Safety Display: A presentation was given by Justice Witness. The topic was Be Smart Education to teach adults about firearm safety. Several years ago we displayed a banner which was accompanied by T-shirts. These T-shirts represented children who had been killed by a firearm. Firearms are the #1 cause of death of children in the USA. The group requests that we display the new banner this year with 40 T-shirts, each shirt representing 4 youth who have been killed by a firearm. Other churches, the hospital and ECC have also been asked to display. They would like us to display for a few days to a week in either June or July. A motion was made and approved to allow the display.

Cemetery Board Presentation on Green Burials: The Cemetery Board has written and approved an update to the Cemetery Rules to allow for Green Burials and requested Council approval. Green Burials were discussed, and the wording of the addition to the Rules was discussed. There will be a west field which will be maintained as the "meadow " field, where green burials are without markers (family gets GPS coordinates) or you can use traditional plots in the rest of the cemetery for green burials, with a marker. The cemetery will operate as mixed--with traditional burials, ash burials and green burials. They are working on brochures for funeral homes. A motion was made and seconded to approve the addition of the Terms of Green Burial to the Cemetery rules. The motion passed. **Treasurer's Report & Finance Board Report**: The General Fund is still positive! There are CDs coming due that will be reinvested. A motion was made and seconded to approve the Finance Board's reinvestment recommendation. The motion passed.

Pastor's Report: The Pastor's Report was reviewed.

Several community events were attended. Pastor Kurt continues his work on the Committee on Ministry. He noted that he thanks the congregation for his selection as the new settled Senior Pastor.

Associate Pastor's Report: The Associate Pastor's Report was reviewed. Pastor Eric will be going to General Synod as a delegate for the Missouri Mid-South Conference, and then will be directing a camp at MoVal.

Boards and Committees: Building and Grounds:

• There is a bid for an air conditioner for the quilting room, as that unit has broken down and needs replacement. They are going to get a window unit for now to get through summer and give time to get more bids.

• There is also a need for tuckpointing and several proposals have been received. This can be added to the July Congregational meeting if needed. We need more info on what Building and Grounds recommends from the tuckpointing bids.

Cemetery Board:

• The Franklin County Cemetery Association has provided help at the cemetery.

• A new section will be laid out.

Worship Committee:

• Had a visit from a seamstress who does a lot of paraments. They are looking at fabric options and design options.

Christian Education:

• Messy Church kitemaking happened on June 11 with about 20 participants. Outdoor flying with the Gateway Kite Club was postponed due to rain and will be rescheduled.

• VBS is set for July 16-19, from 6:30–8 p.m.

•The board is investigating what parents currently want in Christian Education. A survey will be developed and sent.

• The board discussed sharing a write-up on new confirmands / members to introduce them to the congregation.

Mission:

• The blood drive was cancelled due to Red Cross staffing. They are looking at rescheduling.

• They have been collecting items for Care Kits bags. About 20 are completed.

• A mission trip to Back Bay Mission in Mississippi, in the spring of next year is a possibility.

Old Business:

Facility Rental: Prototype printed rental flyers were shared on various paper stock types. The rental price list will be a printed insert that is easily updated. These brochures are planned to be made available around town. A motion to proceed with printing the brochures was made and seconded, and the motion passed.

New Business:

Volunteer Opportunities: A list of things that volunteers could do around the building on a periodic basis could be prepared, like dusting, cleaning, etc. This could be in the form of "Adopt a Room", or" Adopt a Chore", like the raindrop fund.

Building Rental Fund Proposals: At the May meeting, the Event Committee described that they would like to start a fund for upgrading the rental spaces. They proposed 50% of the funeral lunches money to go to this fund until rental income was available. That proposal was not voted on, pending a discussion with Women's Fellowship regarding the proposal as this money has traditionally gone to Women's Fellowship. This proposal also was not voted on at this meeting, and Marty will speak with a Women's Fellowship representative about it. However, at this time the proposal has been changed to get seed money from another fund. The Council suggests that the Event Committee group should present a line-item list of what they need at the July Council meeting. Any income from future rentals is proposed to be added part to the General Fund and part to the Event Committee for items to enhance rental opportunities.

Pastor Review: The process for reviewing pastors was brought up at the Congregational Meeting on Sunday, June 18 and needed further review from Council. There is an employee manual which states that the Council evaluates the Pastors, the Senior Pastor evaluates the staff, with input from Staff Relations if desired

The Justice Witness Group of St. Peter's continues to offer a small lending library located in the Parlor just off the Sanctuary. The books cover a range of topics including current events, religion, racism, aging, personal growth and LGBTQIA. If you have a desire to learn more about any of these issues, please, borrow a book. The process is simple. Just sign your name on the index card inside the front cover and place it in the file box provided. When you're finished reading, just drop it in the green bin provided. There is no need to reshelve the book. We will do that for you.

<u>The Light We Carry</u> by Michelle Obama is the follow up book to <u>Becoming</u>. This is from the dust jacket. "There may be no tidy solutions or pity answers to life's challenges, but Michelle Obama believes that we can all locate and lean on a set of tools to help us better navigate change and remain steady within flux."
